Adopting a Companion

All cats and kittens are tested for feline leukemia, vaccinated for distemper, feline leukemia, rabies (kept current for each cat, depending on age) & micro-chipped. Each feline is spayed/neutered and dewormed. Illness and injuries are treated. Once here, they are treated as our own and kept in our foster homes until permanent homes can be found.

Volunteers are always needed and can help in a variety of ways. Just call. We can put your spare time to good use.

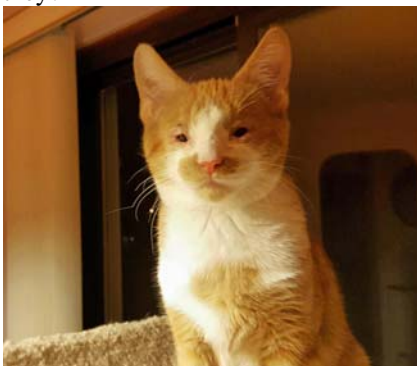
